Welcome to the first email newsletter from Pegasus Toy library. We have an awesome committee at the moment, who is working incredibly hard. It is nice to see the library having a new lease of life. The committee have also bought some new toys in recent months that have been purchased through a recent grant received from Air Rescue Services. So keep an eye out for these.

Our recent stocktake went well; we had a good sort out of our toys. In order to keep our library toys in good condition, we need to turn them over and refresh them. So we are having a **toy sale** on the **19th of September** at 9.30am. It will be held in the function room on the other side of the community centre (by the park). Membership changes – these will take effect from the 1st October 2015. The full membership of \$80 will remain the same (toy hire additional).

The reason for the increase is inflation, we have not had an increase for many years, so in order for us to continue offering you a great service and new toys, we needed to increase the fees.
